

## Pool Safety Checklist for STR Hosts & PMs

Before the summer surge, **use this checklist to prepare your pool** for guest safety, legal compliance, and peace of mind.

This checklist covers key steps to:

- ✓ Strengthen safety protocols
- ✓ Reduce the risk of guest injuries or accidents
- ✓ Protect yourself during a liability claim



## **Pool Safety Checklist**

Safety Barriers  - 4-foot (minimum) fencing installed around the pool - Self-closing, self-latching gate installed - Gate latch positioned out of reach of young children - Fence complies with all local/state pool barrier requirements
Pool Maintenance  □ Pool water tested and treated at least weekly □ Filters and pumps regularly inspected and cleaned □ Pool deck free from cracks, loose tiles, and tripping hazards
Pool Area  Slip-resistant surfaces installed or maintained around the pool Clear depth markers at shallow and deep ends Emergency flotation devices (life ring, hook) easily accessible Fully stocked first-aid kit placed near pool area Fire extinguisher accessible if grill, outdoor kitchen, or firepit is nearby
Pool Rules & Signage  □ "No Diving" signs clearly visible  □ Swim at your own risk signage displayed  □ Rules against running, glass containers, or unsupervised children  □ Emergency 911 instructions posted with property address
Guest Communication  □ Pool rules outlined in the welcome book and/or rental agreement  □ Age restrictions and supervision expectations clearly stated  □ Reminder that swimming is at guest's own risk  □ Disclosure that pool amenities are provided with no lifeguard on duty
